

BRIGHTON JUNIOR BARONS PLAYER ATTENDANCE AND DISCIPLINE POLICY

Any unexcused absence from practice during the week shall make that player ineligible for that week's game.

Players must have no more than one excused absence from practice during the week preceding a game. Missing more than one practice during the week shall make that player ineligible for that week's game.

Excused absences include: Mandatory school function; religious obligation; illness (provided the head coach is notified by the player or guardian before practice begins) and serious injury.

Parent Notification: Head Coach must notify the parents of the affected player prior to the game of any disciplinary action to take place.

Habitual Tardiness:

Every effort should be made for parents to have their players arrive on time to scheduled events, including games and practices. Coaches and parents should work together to avoid tardiness. If after a coach/parent conference, tardiness remains an issue, discipline of the offending player is at the coach's discretion. Head Coach must notify the parents of the affected player of any disciplinary action to take place.

Penalty: Head Coach may discipline player by not playing the player for the first half of the next game. The coach must be consistent and not penalize one player and allow another offender to not be penalized.

Disruptive Behavior:

Parents of player who is disruptive at team events should be consulted for corrective action. If disruptions continue, the coach must notify a Board member to discuss the events and appropriate disciplinary action. Parents must be informed, in advance, of any disciplinary action taken by the Board.

Penalty: Behavior that is against Brighton Junior Barons and/or AYCFL rules is subject to expulsion from Brighton Junior Barons program.
